Big Rock Exploration AB has applied for an exploration permit with very high levels of copper.

Big Rock Exploration AB has applied for an exploration permit which, according to SGU (Sweden Geological Survey), has a content of 9.2% copper. There are several closed mines within the area, the most recent mine was closed in the 1950s. The area is only 2.5 kilometers from the Lovisa mine.

The exploration permit is located in Lindesberg municipality in Bergslagen. The applied area Ingelshyttan no. 9 is an exploration permit of 79.5 hectares. There are a number of slag heaps within the exploration permit and from some slag heaps there are rock samples with very high levels of sulphides.

The company intends to carry out electrical VLF survey as soon as possible to investigate the extent from the old mines in order to identify possible drilling targets as soon as the exploration permit has been approved.
