

Big Rock Exploration's associated company Holmasjön Prospektering AB has started drilling on Kallmora.

Two core boreholes will be drilled during the first week of May. The company drills mainly for copper and rare earth metals.

The drilling will be carried out on Holmasjön Prospektering ABs exploration permit Kallmora no. 3 to investigate which minerals and concentrations have resulted in the extensive magnetic and electrical anomalies that the company measured in the autumn of 2020.

In the vicinity of one of the planned boreholes, SGU has found up to 1.3% copper, 49.80% iron and several rare earth metals in slag heaps from adjacent mines. The rare earth metals are used in electric motors and electronics such as mobile phones, computers. One of the rare earth metals that SGU has found is neodymium (Nd) 116,000 USD / ton.

In the event of good results from the drillings, the company will investigate whether an electric I.P. survey must be performed over the anomalies to get a clearer picture of the anomalies and depth sensing down to 1000 meters or if the company can directly proceed with a comprehensive drilling program to examine the mineral levels over the entire anomalies.
